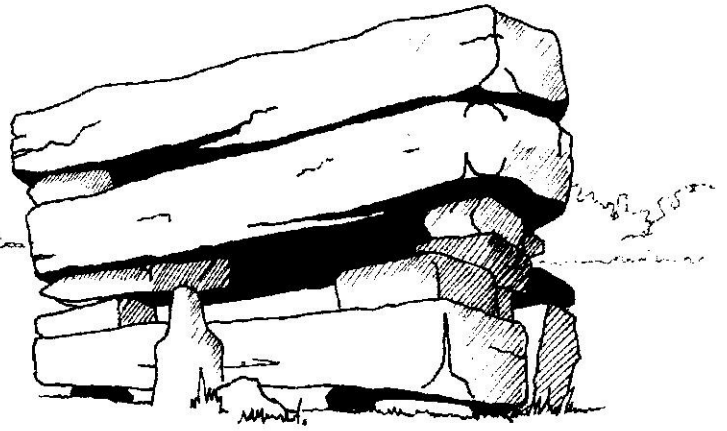

Rock Inn Planning Application

The parish council received a copy of a planning application for the Rock Inn site outlining application for 12 houses. At the parish council meeting on 19 September the following minutes was drafted:

Rock Inn Planning Application

After much discussion, it was agreed that the Clerk should

write to BMBC Planning objecting to the proposed development on the following grounds:

- (a) Scale and character of the proposed development
- (b) Highway safety
- (c) Availability of infrastructure
- (d) Impact on the RIGS site
- (e) Impact on fauna
- (f) Impact on trees

The letter should also ask BMBC to consider alternative schemes, should the development receive permission. One was for a reduction in the size of the Rock Inn with fewer houses being allowed. Green issues such as biomass fuel and "living roofs" should be part of the design of any housing.

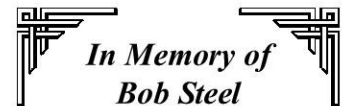
BMBC Planning Regulatory Board overturned the recommendation of the BMBC officers and have granted outline permission for 12 houses on the Rock Inn site

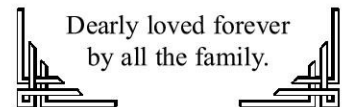
