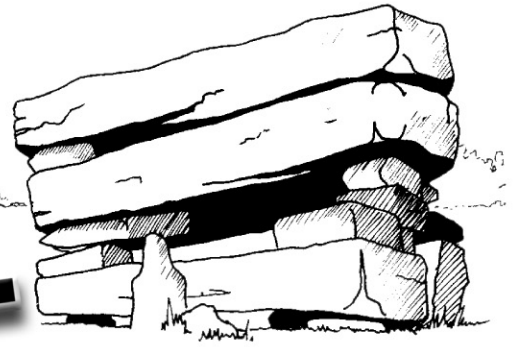

## Britain's Burning!

*A Thousand Beacons Blaze on High  
From London's Centre to the Isle of Skye!*

**Yes, Hunshelf's own Isle of Skye. With the kind permission of Mr N Fielding, the beacon will be lit again on Friday 21 October at 7:15 pm**

The Parish Plan questionnaire returns included a comment that the beacon should be lit when the French were coming! Friday 21 October is the 200th Anniversary of the Battle of Trafalgar a major turning point in European history. As we know the French navy was defeated. We are lighting our beacon to celebrate the

occasion and to reflect that we are now one Europe.

So at 6:30 pm we are assembling at the Providence Room of Green Moor Church ready to process to the Isle of Skye. It is dark at 6:30 pm, so we have torches (flaming) and torches (battery) to light the way. These come courtesy of BMBC's Area Forum Grant. We have enough torches for 60 people, so come soon to make sure you have a torch. When assembled Barry Tylee will lead us on a merry go round the village to the Isle of Skye ready to light

the beacon at 7:15 pm promptly. This is the time the beacon in London will be lit by Her Majesty The Queen, followed by the one in Hunshelf and the other 998 across the country.

Fireworks will follow, this time paid for by the parish council and then afterwards, those unlucky (or too late) to have a torch on the way up, can have a fresh torch to light the way down to the Rock Inn where Gill has promised us pie and peas.

Sorry but the pie and peas and drinks are not being paid for by the parish council or BMBC.

Bring some cash! Sea Shanties may or may not be sung, it depends on whether or not we can find the words. The Chairman and members of the Parish Council look forward to seeing you all on this occasion.
